According to the Denver Post, the average Douglas County *monthly* HOA dues are \$350.00, but some can top \$500-600.00 and some even \$1,000.00. Your annual dues in The Charter are only \$50.00!

Where does this money go, you ask?? Where is it spent, you wonder? Well, here's the scoop...

- Preparing for and hosting the yearly TALENT SHOW! (Some of you may think of this as the annual Election of Officers to the Board, but we like to think out of the box)
- Having laughs and giggles while we stuff Easter eggs, stringing gold bells, preparing advertising for upcoming events, working on the bi-annual Newsletter and just having fun together. We laugh a lot!
- Arranging for and paying over \$1K for Santa, his sleigh and Belgian horses alone in December each year. Add to that indoor festivities and the bill goes way up.! Ho, ho ho...
- 4) Awarding \$50 gift cards each Winter to the HOA homeowner with what the judges consider the most festive light display.
- 5) Yard-of-the-Month Winners selected by fellow homeowners to receive \$50 gift cards in the months of June, July and August each year. We are so proud of all of you who make The Charter so beautiful each Spring and Summer!
- 6) Fees for Food Trucks for Summer and Fall Festivals brought by your HOA Board to The Charter each year that you all love.
- Website maintenance for thecharterhoa.com where you will find a wealth of past and current info.
- 8) Collaborating, writing, editing, printing, collating, stamping and mailing our twice annual full color Newsletter that goes out to each of the 313 homes in The Charter with relevant News and upcoming events. <u>Imagine</u> the cost of the printing, postage and stamped envelopes!
- 9) State of Colorado registration fees, banking fees, HOA liability insurance (which rose by 25% this past year), Legal fees.
- 10) This does <u>NOT</u> include the untold volunteer hours your Board members spend on their phones, computers and in their cars or meetings on your behalf. Think of them as members of your firefighters, they put out so many fires you never see and save you a lot of headaches!

With a large number of active HOA members in The Charter, we will sustain:

- Stabilized Property Values; Properties within an active HOA sell for 5-6% more than one without an HOA. According to a study at George Mason University: Having a well-maintained home in a well-kept neighborhood is attractive to buyers. With HOA residents held accountable for maintaining their properties, property values stay more consistent.
- Reduced Maintenance & Upkeep, Having City that takes care of garbage collection and snow removal can ease the challenges associated with home ownership. Living in a well-maintained neighborhood where we all play our part is aesthetically better and more effortless in which to live.
- Access To Shared Amenities: Some features include, Sweetwater park, walking trails, and sports courts and all that South Suburban has to offer.
- Standards & Dispute Settlement: Homeowners comply with guidelines called Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&Rs) found in your Deed of Trust at the time of closing, which leads to fewer problems between neighbors. Your Association Board mediates disputes between neighbors and enforces consequences when things go wrong.
- Community Engagement: The Charter HOA offers a real sense of togetherness, and organizes community gatherings and activities. Many members enjoy the increased opportunities to socialize and be a part of something bigger.
